Holston Home serves children such as “Sam,” who came to the home when he was 15 after suffering years of abuse and drug addiction. When Sam came to Holston Home, workers said he seemed more like an 8-year-old and was very withdrawn. During his stay, the release said, Sam received the help he needed to overcome his addiction. He also learned about the God who loves him with an unconditional love. Today, Sam has a good job, his own house, and is married with a new baby. His life is completely different because of the time he spent at HUMHC.

“Last year, Holston Home touched the lives of more than 700 children and youth,” said Bradley Williams, Holston Home president. “By supporting our Friends of Children dinners, such as this one in Knoxville, you are giving youth like Sam hope for a brighter future.”
