Holston Home To Present Free Movie At The Capitol

The Bradfords founded a non-profit organization in 2005 called Elijah’s Heart to help children in need.

person for event. “At HUMHC, we are especially touched by his heart for children struggling with life’s challenges. As advocates for children in need, we want to be a part of sharing the story with our community.”

and fun night out for families in an iconic setting of vintage Greenville.”

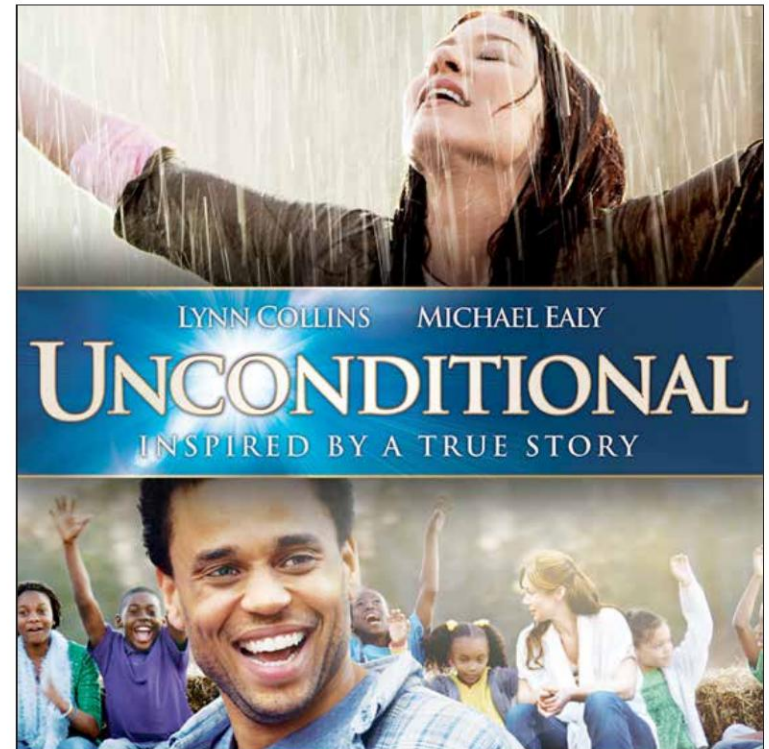
