

Anna arrived at Holston United Methodist Home for Children appearing to have the world by the tail. A beautiful young lady, she is bright, articulate and seemed to be full of confidence. On the inside she carries the scars and wounds of all types of abuse and hurts from adults who violated her trust. She would go back and forth between the strong and talented young lady that God made her to be and the traumatized and scared girl that the enemy wanted her to be. Our team committed to love her unconditionally. However, after efforts to harm herself,

Anna was hospitalized so that we could make sure she was safe. We continued to reach out to her and express our love and concern. We pursued her with love just like Jesus pursues each of us and those around us.

Anna was able to come back to Holston Home right before Christmas, and we met her with open arms. After a short time, Anna started to become

unsafe again, and she told us something so honest and yet so heartbreaking at the same time. She said that she had to get out of here because she had never been so loved and it was too much and too uncomfortable. She said that she wanted to go back to the hospital where she was just a patient. Satan had used the sin and selfishness of others in her life to convince this beautiful girl that she wasn't worthy of love.

I am reminded of what Paul writes in Ephesians 6:12 – our fighting is not against the flesh and blood enemies, but it is against the



spiritual forces of evil. Anna is still here and we are still fighting with the amazing love of Jesus. Although we are in the middle of Anna's story and I can't tell you how it ends, I can tell you with the perfect hope that is in our Lord that there have been untold numbers of "Annas" that have come to Holston Home over the last 120 years. We have seen firsthand how God's love can change lives even in the toughest circumstances. John encourages us that "perfect love drives out fear." This is true even in Anna's fear that she isn't meant to be loved.







A Glimpse Of History

The stated purpose of Holston Orphanage, at its inception, was to "Care for, train, and educate the helpless, neglected children, orphaned or otherwise, of the territory comprised of the Holston Conference..." Mrs. Wiley's staff and volunteers provided whatever class instruction was provided, but that soon became an overwhelming task.

Matrons and secretaries doubled as teachers and were demanding a salary increase. On August 31, 1916, the



board voted to send all schoolage children to Greeneville City Schools. This apparently did not work out, presumably because such a large number of students taxed the workload of available teachers and the facilities. After only two days, the Greeneville Board of Education proposed to pay the orphanage if the "manager"

(later called the Superintendent) would agree to maintain a school at the orphanage.

In 1917, children above the fourth grade were sent to public school. By 1918, an agreement was reached between the Greeneville Board of Education and the orphanage for the City to provide teachers for the orphanage elementary classes on campus and high school students attended public schools or Hiwassee College, which, at that time, was both a high school and a two-year college. This agreement held for many years.

When the move was made to the "new campus" in 1954 and the student population was reduced to 60, all of the children attended public schools.

In the late 1960's, the Holston Home staff realized that emotional and behavioral problems of children in care were increasing and many children were having difficulty learning in the public school setting. Special classes were established on campus which provided intensive, skilled instruction in reading writing, math and study skills. This concept of helping children with academic deficits eventually evolved into Beacon School on campus.
